GUIDELINES

- Scarecrows can be displayed from now, however, they **must** be on display from Sunday 17th September until Sunday 24th September (the competition period).
- Scarecrows should be displayed on land owned by you, for example in your front garden (or anywhere else visible from a public space), visible to the public.
- Scarecrows must have the generic A4 'entry slip' pinned to their front (like a runner in a race). Use the back side of this leaflet, or download more from www.littleburstead.com
- You must bring your scarecrow to Afternoon Tea at the Village Hall at 1pm on Sunday 24th September for judging
 and voting. When you bring your scarecrow to the Hall, we will give them their own seat to sit on so be prepared to
 arrange them on a seat.
- Attendees can vote for the winners: voting to be done between 2pm and 3pm to allow time to process the voting slips before the prizegiving at the end of the Afternoon Tea.
- There will be two prizes awarded. One will be decided by the judges and the other by voters. Judges will decide the scarecrow that demonstrates the most creativity and originality. Voters will provide a popular winner.
- At the end of the Afternoon Tea please be prepared to take your scarecrow home with you.


RULES

- 1. Everyone in Little Burstead is welcome to enter the competition children and adults.
- 2. Scarecrows must be minimum height 1 metre maximum height 2 metres.
- 3. Scarecrows must have been on public display for the duration of the competition period (dates above) and arrive at the Village Hall at 1pm Sunday 24th September to be eligible for a prize.
- 4. Scarecrows must have the generic A4 'entry slip' pinned to their front (like a runner in a race). Use the back side of this leaflet, or download more from www.littleburstead.com
- 5. Scarecrows must be made and displayed in good taste. Entrants designing their scarecrow to cause deliberate offence will be disqualified.
- 6. Scarecrows must be built from scratch (no commercial creations, please) and made of recycled materials only. Please do not buy things to make your scarecrow, including shop bought masks.
- 7. Scarecrows must be displayed so they don't cause an accident, they don't blow away, and will not otherwise be a danger or possibly cause injury to anyone. Little Burstead Village Hall Committee cannot be held responsible for any damage to property caused by your creation or insecurity of scarecrows.
